MANDATE

Indian Agricultural Universities Association, (IAUA) is nearing to complete 50 years in 2017, as it was established on 10 Nov. 1967 (Registration no. 3489). There were only 9 founder-member agricultural universities; and their VCs were: founder president Dr P.N. Thaper, VC, PAU, Chandigarh (now Ludhiana); and members Shri V. Pulla Reddy, VC, APAU (now ANGRAU), Hyderabad; Dr J.S. Patel, VC, JNKVV, Jabalpur; Shri D.P. Singh, VC, UPAU (now GBPUAT), Pantnagar; Dr K.C. Nair, VC, UAS, Bangaluru; Dr S.N. Das Gupta, VC, KU, Kalyani (now BCKV, Mohanpur); Dr K. Ramaiya, VC, OUAT, Bhubaneshwar; Dr G.S. Mahajani, VC, UU (now MPUAT), Udaipur; and Dr M.S. Swaminathan, Director, IARI, New Delhi.

During this period there has been phenomenal increase in the number of agricultural universities. Till date we have 67 regular member universities, viz: 59 SAUs, 4 DUs (IARI, IVRI, NDRI and CIFE) and 4 CAUs (Imphal, BHU, DRPCAU and RLBCAU). On specialization there are 43 Agricultural, 6 Horticultural; 15 Veterinary and Animal Sciences and 3 Fishery Science Universities. During the initial 30 years IAUA organized fewer events, i.e. 24 annual VCs' conventions during 1972-99; but later on the events as well as their types (categories) increased, i.e. 41 events during 1999-2017, including 17 VCs' Conventions, 11 National Symposia, 7 Brain-storming Sessions, 6 Regional Committee Meetings.

The main objective of the Association is to promote agricultural research, education and extension in the universities and the states, and thereby rural development in the country. It also acts as a bureau of information to facilitate communication, co-ordination and mutual consultation among agricultural universities. The Association also acts as a liaison between member universities and government departments to facilitate communication and expedite the needed action in matters of importance.

All the SAUs and institutions (deemed-to-be universities and central agricultural universities) in India, which provide an integrated programme of teaching, research and extension education in agricultural sciences, are qualified to become regular members of the Association.

The vice-chancellors of member universities constitute the Association's General Body. The General Body meets once a year to decide the agenda for the next convention and other events and also to adopt its audited accounts of the year besides approval of the budget estimates for the next financial year, and the election of office-bearers for the following calendar year. The Executive Committee of the Association consists of President, Vice-President, Secretary-General, Treasurer and three members. The Executive Committee meets quarterly.

The office of the Association is manned by Executive Secretary, who implements the decisions of General Body and Executive Committee on behalf of the Association. A quarterly Newsletter is also being published by the Association since 2000, giving important news, events and achievements by member universities for the information of all the members and others interested. An Annual Report is also published, documenting all the activities of the year.

The information on events and proceedings are published through the host universities, and the recommendations are also included in website (www.iauaindia.org) and circulated to all the VCs of member universities and other main stake-holders.

The main source of revenue of the Association is the annual subscription from member universities. The ICAR also provides a nominal grant annually.

EVENTS

 1) 11th National Symposium on: "Positioning NARES for Vocational Education" held at Madras Veterinary College, TNVASU, Chennai during 28 - 29 May 2016.

Recommendations:

The major recommendations of the Symposium are given below.

- Steps need to be taken to curb mushrooming of private agricultural colleges in the country.
- Popularize millet cultivation for nutritional security, resilient crops and reduce carbon foot-print in livestock farming and technological development for mechanization in major horticultural crops.
- 3. Skilled Development Programmes, based on employability and demand potential to be identified in a scientific basis, offering vocational training using polytechnic courses in

crop production, animal husbandry, fisheries, farm machinery and food industry, with financial support of Union and State Governments adopting uniform course content as possible with flexible option under bodies like the ICAR, VCI etc. (Level I: KVKs, Level II: SAUs).

- 4. Improve the entrepreneurial skills in students, which should enable conservation of resources and overcome seasonal unemployment.
- 5. Conserve indigenous crops/ breeds with their role in agricultural and livestock farming.
- 6. Focus on genetic screening of livestock, embryo sexing and semen sexing.
- 7. Improve "Service delivers" for all sectors, especially for pig farming.
- 8. Establish linkage to local demand and equal-gender involvement.
- 9. To develop technology Business Incubators ('Start- ups' Rural Vet Pharma involving Indian medicine, small farm machinery workshop etc.) with IAUA to formulate a policy for development of a sustainable model of incubation centres.
- 10. To go for quality publication for better impact than quantity.
- 7th Brain-storming session on: "Youth and Smart Agriculture: Challenges and Opportunities", held at PJTSAU, Rajendranagar (Hyderabad) during 28 – 29 September 2016.

Recommendations:

The major recommendations of the Sessions are given below.

- To promote capacity building among youth in terms of knowledge-based agriculture, encompassing climate-resilient technologies and farm mechanism for profitable agriculture.
- 2. Curriculum development in agricultural education should include enterprise development in agri-related businesses.
- 3. Co-ordinated efforts of all the organizations (public, private, and voluntary) working in and for agriculture are needed for synergy in empowering youth towards agripreneurship and smart agriculture.
- 4. Encourage 'Start- ups' to serve as mentors to the out-going graduate students in the final year in their respective agri- enterprises.
- 5. Impart focused training in identified areas for the faculty of universities in agripreneurship.
- Effective technical back-stopping and hand-holding with regard to finance and skill towards conversion of youth into successful agri-entrepreneurs for sustainable livelihoods.
- 7. Reorient agriculture system to the present needs by making use of tools such as Remote Sensing, GIS, GPS, use of sensors, drones, mobile technology, different web portals for data mining and bio-informatics etc.
- 8. Agricultural graduate students should register one e-course and the faculty should use one e-book during the period of the course.

- 9. Harness employment opportunities in agriculture related services like water, insurance, credit, inputs, market linkages and technologies.
- 10. Introduce agriculture and allied subjects as a part of curriculum at primary school (STEMA) level to attract youth towards choosing agriculture as a profession.
- 11. Increase fellowships for PG education in agriculture and allied subjects to promote higher education for developing a talented technical human resource in the field.
- 3) 41st Vice-Chancellors Convention on: "Food for Health under Climate Change" held at KU, Gandhinagar, Gujarat during 20th -21st December, 2016
 Recommendations:

The major recommendations of the Convention are given below.

- 1. Establish early-warning system to mitigate and devise managemental plan related to climate change in the country.
- 2. Establish efficient database management system for agriculture and allied fields to develop policy tools.
- 3. Policy shall be developed for burning crops, diversification, cold refrigeration and digital documentations in agriculture..
- 4. Policy to be developed for river cross linking, integrated farming, climate smart agriculture, organic farming etc.
- 5. Seed storage systems should be implemented in a decentralized manner.
- 6. Development of technologies for the agricultural by–product utilization needs to be implemented properly to reduce wastes. Various Agricultural Universities should take initiative for its proper implementation and utilization.
- 7. Devise and standardize the protocol for animal-waste management in India.
- 8. Organize One Health One World programme in collaboration with Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and World Health Organization (WHO) for production of healthy food under climate change.
- 9. In Fisheries sector, due to climate change, especially there is dying up of streams in hills and mountains where stock broods are sustained for reproduction for the next season. The Government should take steps to establish gene banks and breeding units of all indigenous species to release sufficient young ones as a part of river ranging to sustain the stock.
- 10. Waste water from different sources (municipal, industries, hydroelectric plants) should be properly treated and reused for aquaculture.



The Bt-chickpea lines so developed in collaboration with CSIRO, Canberra and NRCPB, New Delhi are being tested in confined field trials (BRLI) by the private partner-M/S Sungro Seeds. Dr Sarmah has been currently acting as members of four important Expert committee/ Task Force of Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, and is serving as editorial board member of two leading international journals of plant sciences.

It shows that total income of the Association is Rs 89,28,801 (i.e. Rs 67,00,000 as membership subscription and Rs 22,28,801 as interest from bank); and total expenditure Rs 43,61,261. At the close of the financial year 2016-17 the Association has fixed deposits of Rs 2,08,93,636 (Rupees Two crore eight lakh ninety three thousand six hundred thirty six only), which will be Rs 3,00,82,446 (Rupees three crore eighty two thousand four hundred forty six only) on maturity in 2019.
